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the Secretary of State's provision or the director didn't provide it, to post any results at the precinct level.

MR. VU: That's correct.

MR. BENNETT: I have a problem with that because it seems to me it's very easy to run off another copy of this, and if they will post it at the precinct level as an additional step, security step, that I think would benefit the general public to be able to see posted -- We used to always post the results until we got to punch card voting at the precinct location.

So that anybody in the neighborhood could go to that precinct and look at the election results. Notwithstanding the Secretary of State directive is I would hope that this Board would go on record that in the future elections that we actually run off a separate report, and we post it at the precinct level as an additional security for the voters to know what is cast.

MS. FLORKIEWICZ: Right.

MR. VU: We could very well easily

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accommodate that, and we can add that into our instructions to our poll worker's manual as well as instruct them.

MR. SOGGS: Question Chairman, this is the ballots cast, correct? Meaning not results, but ballots cast?

MR. BENNETT: Yes. But no. It would actually be results for that precinct.

MS. MAIDEN: It would be the votes for that location.

MR. SOGGS: That makes sense.

MR. BENNETT: And in prior years it was always headed, Unofficial Results.

MS. FLORKIEWICZ: Right.

MR. ORADINI: Unless the director just says you're not required if it doesn't say that. You can still do it.

MR. VU: It was just a special notice.

References to Blackwell's Oct 4, '05 Special Notice, saying accumulation would be done "centrally" and that counties need not post election results at polling places.
